## Introduction

Our school plan is designed to support all members of Highfield South Farnham School and residents. This plan is primarily directed at reducing unnecessary or unsustainable car travel made by staff, pupils and their parents made to and from the school.

- ✓ The key benefits which can result following the implementation of a travel plan are outlined below;
- ✓ Less cars, traffic congestion and irresponsible parking on Talbot Road, Ryle Road and Weydon Farm Lane.
- ✓ Healthier, happier and more active pupils, families and staff.
- ✓ Less pollution around school reducing motorised traffic and increasing pedestrian traffic to make everyone feel safer and encourage interaction with other individuals on their journey to school.

## Mission Statement

At Highfield South Farnham School, we are committed to fostering a healthier, more sustainable future for our pupils, staff, and local community. Our School Travel Plan aims to reduce our carbon footprint, encourage safe and active travel, and promote a culture of well-being through walking and public transport.

We strive to create a school environment that prioritises safety, physical activity, and environmental responsibility. By encouraging our school community to make more sustainable travel choices, we aim to reduce congestion around the school, improve air quality, and support the health and well-being of everyone who travels to and from Highfield South Farnham School.

Through collaboration with our pupils, families, staff, and local community, we will continue to create a safe, enjoyable, and accessible journey for all members of our school community, ensuring that travel to school is an enriching experience that aligns with our ethos and values.

## Issues with Cars around our School

The main entrance to school is on Weydon Lane with a secondary smaller entrance on Ryle Road. Weydon Lane is a main road whilst Ryle Road and Talbot Road sit within a residential area. The vast majority of parents and carers park carefully and considerately around the school and, in doing so, help safeguarding our relationship with local residents. Unfortunately, a few anti-social drivers, who do not consider the whole community, continue to park on pavements and in front of driveways and on private land. We receive complaints from neighbours about parked cars and unsafe driving. We encourage people to report unsafe driving to us at [HSF Parking Awareness](#).

## School Context

Highfield South Farnham stands on an attractive two-acre site sitting in the south of Farnham. We are a Primary and Nursery School situated on Weydon Lane.

The school opened in February 2015 as part of South Farnham Educational Trust, welcoming pupils in the age range 3-11 years. We currently have approximately 480 students.

The learning environment includes a well-equipped library, a music studio including three small group learning rooms, an additional learning zone and food technology area. A multipurpose hall, used on a daily basis, offers a full range of gymnastic apparatus and performance space. The two acres of play area include grassed sports fields, EYFS playground, a football court, an adventure playground, and a woodland learning space.

The school can be accessed by car (staff and blue badge holders only) through one main gate situated on Weydon Lane, additionally we have pedestrian gates that are accessible via Weydon Lane and Ryle Road. There are always staff members on each gate at both drop off and pick up time.

## What have we done?

- ✓ Ongoing promotion of walking to school with assemblies.
- ✓ Walk to school week in May.
- ✓ Members of SLT are on duty each day to greet families and children at drop and pick up.
- ✓ Requested frequent unannounced visits from the traffic wardens during drop off and pick up times.
- ✓ Ensure communication is sent to parents regarding appropriate parking and respecting residents in the newsletter.
- ✓ Bike ability and feet first training for students throughout 2026.

## Challenges

- Weydon Lane serves Weydon School, a large residential area and an industrial area. HVG lorries frequently travel along Weydon Lane daily, including peak drop off and pick up times. Especially when the bridge on Wrecclisham Road is closed. Weydon Lane is congested during school drop off and pick up times.
- The lane situation on Weydon Lane facing Highfield does not have a crossing or a pedestrian pathway and safety is a concern.
- The lane to the east of Highfield passing Buildbase can only be accessed during dry weather due to flooding. This lane can be access from Upper Way and Arthur Road.
- Ryle road is a narrow residential road with houses opposite and to each side of the school.
- Parking is extremely limited due to the nature of people's driveways.
- Paths are adequate but generally congested with cars parking on or partially on the pavement, which causes children and parents to walk in the road to navigate them.
- We have had two visits from the Waverly Transport Department who have sited we are high up on the priority list, we have been told we will be undated in March 2026.

**ARE YOU READY FOR YOUR SAFE ADVENTURES?**

**START HERE** It's your first solo journey to secondary school! You've done the practice walk, you've got this!

Explore the scenarios to see if you're ready to take on independent journeys to school and beyond!

If you reach a dead-end, go back and think again!

**1** You've waved good-bye and you're on your way. You're a bit late this morning and need to make up time. There are two routes you can take. You....

**TRY AGAIN** Take the shortcut and cross in-between parked cars. Walk down the street to use the crossing.

**2** You're about to cross the road when your phone buzzes. You...

**TRY AGAIN** Wait until you have safely crossed the road. Look at it straight away - it could be important!

**3** You've reached a pedestrian crossing and pressed the button. You...

**TRY AGAIN** Stop and wait for the green man and then check traffic has stopped in both directions. Run across the road as soon as there's a gap.

**5** You're waiting to cross a road. You stand...

**TRY AGAIN** On the pavement behind the kerb, avoiding bends or the top of hills where you can't see clearly. On the edge of the kerb - so it's quicker to get across the road.

**4** Before you cross the road, you stop and...

**TRY AGAIN** Look one way then start across the road. Look right, look left, and look right again to double check that it's clear before you cross.

**6** You see a car coming towards you, but you think there's enough time to cross. You...

**TRY AGAIN** Wait - it's not worth the risk. Sprint across the road - you're pretty fast.

**7** Outside the school, a bus stopped at the bus stop is blocking your view. You...

**TRY AGAIN** Cross in front of the bus. Wait until the bus leaves and you can see the whole road - remember Eyes Up, Slow Down and Cross Safely!
